

Quick guide to accommodation areas in Birmingham

Perry Barr

Perry Barr houses a small - medium student community and offers affordable living costs. There are shopping facilities at the One Stop Shopping Mall, with good rail and bus connections to the centre of Birmingham, which is about 3.4 miles away. It takes about 15-20 minutes by bus to the city.

City centre

Birmingham has seen massive regeneration within the last 15 years, with developments such as the Bullring offering a range of shopping and entertainment options. The city is served by mainline railway stations, all of which are within walking distance of The University of Law: The Jewellery Quarter and Snow Hill are the nearest, a 10 minute walk away. New Street and Moor Street stations are the furthest away, a 20 minute walk away. The city is also served by the Metro, which runs from Snow Hill to St. Paul's and Jewellery Quarter stations. St. Paul's is a 5 minute walk from the University. The city is well served by buses, a number of which stop just outside the University. A bus journey from the centre of Birmingham to the University takes about 5-7 minutes.

Harborne & Edgbaston

Harborne has a busy high street full of shops, restaurants and pubs. Good links mean that you are about 15 minutes away by bus from an evening out in the city.

Selly Oak

Selly Oak is home to a large student community, offering good local amenities including restaurants, cafes, pizzerias and sandwich shops. There are excellent bus and rail links to the centre of Birmingham which is about 3.5 miles away. Journeys take about 15-20 minutes, but allow at least 30 minutes travelling to The University of Law at busier times.

Aston

This area has a medium - large student community and the living costs remain similar to Perry Barr. It is about 2.4 miles from the centre of Birmingham. There are both bus and rail links to the city and journeys take between 5-10 minutes.

St. Pauls Square & Jewellery Quarter

The University of Law is situated between St Paul's Square and the Jewellery Quarter. In recent years, this area has seen huge regeneration and is now popular with city workers. Both areas have plenty of bars and restaurants. The Jewellery Quarter has a post office, high street banks, supermarkets, cafes and plenty of jewellery shops. Our nominated accommodation provider - The Canalside is located 10 minutes walk from the University.

Kings Heath & Moseley

King's Heath is about 5.1 miles from the city centre and Moseley about 3.4 miles. Both areas have excellent high streets with pubs, restaurants and shops. Moseley is situated near to Sparkhill, Birmingham's famous Balti District. Both Moseley and Kings Heath have good bus links to the city centre, with journeys taking about 20 minutes.
